## School Board Representative, Steven Carrillo

Most powerful tool to effect change is by attending the School Board public forum. Current examples: 1) a student complained that recess was being cut here and there, due to time constraints in scheduling or as a punishment; a policy was written to prohibit recess from being cut; 2) $75 \%$ of students in SFPS middle and high school are vaping. Vaping resolution: call on the legislature to treat vaping the same as alcohol (must be age 21 and over to purchase, cannot be advertised or sold in school; if parents allow vaping in home except to children other than their own, they can be charged with a $4^{\text {th }}$ degree felony).

School Board meetings are the $1^{\text {st }}$ and $3^{\text {rd }}$ Tuesdays of the month. The next meeting will be Tuesday at 5:30 (school performance first; public forum begins around 5:45 pm).

## Principal Report

MAPS testing is almost finished and included assessments in reading, language and math. Makeups should be finished by Friday.

Parents will be getting information about their child's performance from the teacher; teachers will use data will be used to individualize IXL.

New message boards have arrived and will be welded to the fences.

The board to control lights in cafeteria/ theater must be mounted to the ceiling; Mara will work with Ms. Jeffery to put in a work order.

Regarding vaping: Children want a safe school and have reported others who have been observed vaping. Ms. Jeffery has not had to initiate disciplinary action for vaping.

Back to School bash is this Saturday; please come and volunteer or help out.

Electrical cords: PTC might consider purchasing some for the future, as they are needed for several PTC events throughout the year. This Friday at Movie Night, the cords will be laid after gates are closed so that no cars will drive over them.

## Treasurer Report

PTC operating expenses are almost used up. We agreed it would be appropriate to move the expense of the message boards to playground/outdoors budget.

Classroom supplies: Ms. Jeffery will encourage teachers to use half of their allocation by December break and will set a deadline for spring requests.

The supplement was lowered in this year's budget to $\$ 476.25$ for full-time teachers, less for part-time/ specials teachers.

## Professional Development:

Two level 3 master teachers hosted a 3 hour session for Readers and Writers Workshop in August, which was very well-received.

We would also like to bring a Eureka math instructor out for a training, perhaps on Election Day. (all classes except $2^{\text {nd }}$ grade and one $6^{\text {th }}$ grade section are now using Eureka Math).

## Food donations

Per Rachel: we will be able to get coffee for free from a parent who owns a coffee shop, as well as some baked goods; Justin from Rio Chama will try to get tamales for Fall Festival, but can no longer commit to providing the $1^{\text {st }}$ teacher luncheon.

Ana has ties to Santa Fe Dining and her husband works with several restaurants in town. She will work on securing donations for the $1^{\text {st }}$ teacher luncheon.

## Tax-exempt purchases

Dion's is tax-exempt; we must provide them a letter with our tax ID.

Home Depot is also tax-exempt; extension cords could be purchased there.

## Movie Night Update- Carrie Wood

- The movie itself will start around 7:30 \& end around 9:30.
- We still need help with cleanup (no one has signed up on Signup Genius). We are getting a discount for screen from Santa Fe Av (assuming we have 4 helpers to take down).
